If you feel you may have been unfairly treated or wish to raise any specific grievance please refer to the following procedure for dealing with complaints:

COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE:

- 1.1 The trustees try to ensure that each application that matches our priorities and guidance is considered, although there can be no guarantee of funding. However if having spoken to our Director you are not satisfied you can appeal to the Chair of Trustees.
 - 1.2 You should mark the letter 'Private & Confidential' and name the person and their office, currently: Maggie Elliott (Chair of Trustees)

 - 1.3 You may submit the complaint by email to london.catalyst@peabody.org.uk, although it is not possible to treat this form of electronic communication as confidential.
 - 1.4 The Chair of Trustees will then consider the complaint and we will aim to respond in writing within one month from the date the complaint was received.
 - 1.5 If the complaint is initially upheld by the Chair the next stage will be for the Chair to convene an appeal panel which will make a final decision within two months from the date the complaint was received.
 - 1.6 If you feel the complaint involves a serious breach of fiduciary duty or charitable governance, contact Companies House and the Charity Commission. Please note that neither regulatory body intervenes in matters of procedure or trustee decisions.
